GOOGONG FAITH COMMUNITY

Sunday 26 of June marked the beginning of bringing the Eucharist to the people of God at Googong, with the Anglican school being our host. At our first gathering we welcomed 79 people to the celebration, which was fantastic. Ten weeks on, I thought I would give you a report on how things are going and some thoughts from me, your Parish Priest.

Forming a new faith community in a fast growing estate such as Googong, is always going to be an exciting prospect and it is going to take time to establish itself and I realise that. However, our numbers are not as strong as I thought they would be, we are down to about 31 people. At the beginning of our move to Googong I said I would stay until the end of the December, which I am happy to do, but things are not looking the best.

Let us look at some statistics. When we were having the Sunday 5.30 at St Raphael's our numbers according to the Australian Catholic Bishop Conference 2021 report were about 93 to 109. Noting that this report was done during the covid pandemic when we were coming out of a "lock down" period and our numbers were just starting to come back. What concerns me is the number difference between Googong and St Raphael's and at least 60 people have been displaced.

As I said, I am happy to continue until the end of the year, the warmer weather may bring about a change. So I want to hear from you especially the people of Googong and the attendees of the old Sunday 5.30pm Mass, please give me your thoughts.

Thank you to everyone who has donated baskets of flowers, the outside of our church is looking alive, bright and vibrant.
